

Ubuntu Wolfram competition

Terms and Conditions

1. By entering the Competition, you agree to be bound by the Terms and Conditions. Any entries not complying with the Terms and Conditions will not be valid.

Entry

4. You enter into the Competition by tweeting the most original findings from your collected sensor data, on Twitter using the hashtag **#UbuntuWolfram**. Only one entry per person will be permitted.
5. The Competition will open on 26th April 2016 at 10:00 GMT and close on 26th May 2016 at 12:00 GMT. Any entries submitted after the closing date will not be considered.

Winner notification and prize
